ICIE is a non-profit, non-partisan group formed in 1989 to focus discussion of the environment on the facts.

What we do

The projects and programs we produce and collaborate on are designed to provide an education for policy makers and those who influence them, and the general public. Last year these projects and programs included:

- ICIE's Annual Membership Meeting
- ICIE's Environmental/Regulatory Affairs Committee analyzes issues and advises agencies and legislators of their conclusions on environmental questions

- Practical Paths: a workshop series focusing on a different topic area each year
- Earth Day Art Contest: A juried art show where students are encouraged to focus their art on a specific topic related to the environment
